Lutherhaven & COVID-19 Update

From all of us at Lutherhaven Ministries—Camp Lutherhaven, Shoshone Mountain Retreat, Shoshone Creek Ranch, Idaho Servant Adventures, and McPherson Meadows—we pray this finds you and your family and friends well, healthy, and hope-filled...in Jesus!

These are without a doubt significant times.

Lutherhaven journeys alongside you in facing significant new challenges.

We are all making significant decisions in response to these challenges.

And through it all, God daily calls each of us to love, support, and encourage one another in significant ways.

In the weeks since March 1, endeavoring to be part of the global solution to the coronavirus pandemic, Lutherhaven's leadership team has devoted daily attention to the news of the world, news around the region, and news especially from the many communities dotting the country that Lutherhaven Ministries serves.

The Lutherhaven staff have worked hard to put together another exciting summer—our 75th—of terrific camp and retreat programs for all ages at all four of our sites. We've been eagerly counting the days to another summer filled with friends, families, evening campfires, mountain peaks, sunsets over the waters, and most of all, the chance to experience God's love for us outdoors in creation, together in community, centered in Jesus Christ.

It's clear, however, that Lutherhaven has an important responsibility to help prevent the spread of Covid-19. We're therefore convinced summer camp 2020 at Lutherhaven Ministries—as at summer camps around the nation—must look very different than summer camp ever has before.

The Board of Directors and leadership staff of Lutherhaven Ministries — attentive to the direction of federal, state, and local health agencies — is putting on hold all gatherings of people at our camps, through the month of June.

We did not make this decision easily, nor do we take it lightly. Some building blocks of that decision:

- Lutherhaven brings in staff and campers from at least 18 states around the nation, in June especially.
- We know restrictions on gathering numbers of staff, campers, and families from across different regions will continue at least into June.
- Summer camp is the opposite of social distancing! Restrictions on large groups of people together in social settings, recreation, worship gatherings, celebrations, dining, and other camp settings will continue for some time.
- We await guidelines for how best to manage campers in overnight sleep-over settings.

At the heart of Lutherhaven Ministries is the well-being and safety of our campers and guests, so we are suspending camp programs through June. This includes postponement of school programs, staff training, weekend retreats, worship services, and summer camp programs.

In mid-May the Board and leadership staff will gather to look at July and August options for camp.

Never before in Lutherhaven's 75 years has there been a decision so difficult to make. The financial ramifications will be great and may yield more difficult decisions. But we are convinced this decision is what is best for all whom we are called to serve during this time.

Over the course of the next weeks, all May and June camp participants and retreat guests will be called by a member of our guest services team with options regarding rescheduling and answers to your questions.

Meanwhile, staff are busy creating contingent youth and family programs and opportunities at our sites for the rest of summer, as we await clearance from regional public health departments to provide safe camp experiences for communities of people. Staff are also taking advantage of this time of Sabbath rest for our facilities to make site improvements.

We are confident, with no doubt, that on the other side of Covid-19, Lutherhaven Ministries will emerge a stronger outdoor ministry organization—all thanks to God! This global crisis we face together has given us significant opportunity to pause, reflect, evaluate, and innovate, so that programs at each of our four uniquely magnificent ministry sites are ready to serve—more and better—children, youth, adults, and families from across the country and around the world.

Thanks for your continued partnership and support of Lutherhaven Ministries. As we continue to pray for you, we ask for your prayers in return, and your continued support and generosity towards this ministry we all love deeply.
